Update on Brigil Development on Baseline

Brigil has confirmed that demolition and excavation on the site of the Monster Hallowe'en store will begin in the next 3 months. Brigil reported that they are meeting with grocery retailers and will advise us when a contract is signed.

Culvert Replacement in Leslie Park

The City has confirmed the culvert over Graham Creek that runs under the grass in the park will be physically removed and replaced from the CN rail line to the outlet at the north end of Leslie Park. The work could begin as early as this fall and continue through the winter months. We are waiting for answers from the City on the impacts this will have on accessing the park and the outdoor rink. We have also made a request for the City to consider how a path between Leslie Park and Trend Arlington could be built while this heavy construction is underway. More info to come!

Summer Relief!

We are happy to confirm that a portable toilet will be placed in the park again this summer season. Expect to see it installed by mid-May. If there are issues with the toilet over the summer, please call the telephone number on the door to report it.

Preventing Crime in Leslie Park

The community experienced a rash of car break ins over the winter, with multiple homes and streets being hit on the same night. As always, keeping cars, garages, sheds and windows locked is an effective crime deterrent.

Our neighbourhood does not have a lot of overhead lighting and it is unlikely that the City will invest in this infrastructure anytime soon. Keeping Leslie Park safe and well lit is up to us. Please ensure that you have exterior lighting on your property – ideally at the front and back of your home. If you have a lamp post on your front lawn, make sure it is working.

If you need assistance changing an exterior light – don't worry! Just contact <u>info@lesliepark.ca</u> and a volunteer will come to your home to try and give you a hand.
