OUTDOOR RINK NEWS

Today the rink maintenance staff started to flood for the rink base ice. We expect to have the rink ready between Christmas and New Year's (weather dependent – lol). We would appreciate if the community stayed off the rink until we open it for skating.

The rink will be open as follows:

To address COVID concerns, the following 3 new practices will be implemented *only* if using the Field House, as per City of Ottawa requirements:

- 1. High-contact surfaces in the Field House are required to be wiped down by the Rink Supervisors at the <u>start, middle and end of a shift (i.e., every hour)</u>, with cleaning supplies provided by the City of Ottawa. These include all doorknobs, light switches, the pen on the clipboard, all benches inside the Field House and the desk in the office.
- 2. Masks are mandatory inside the Field House and the number is limited to 3 skaters at one time. (Benches will be available outside.)
- 3. Anyone using the trailer will be asked to complete a Contact Tracing form, as required by the City of Ottawa.

For those who want to use the rink without using the Field House, additional outdoor benches are available. Masks are not required outdoors while skating or using the outdoor benches. Social distancing practices, however, should be respected.

The City of Ottawa Guidelines indicate that hockey is an acceptable activity.

GRAHAM CREEK UPDATE

This summer, a new home builder caused quite a stir in our community. A young beaver took up residence in Graham Creek near our park and was met with curiosity and interest but also concern as he took down trees at a steady rate to build a dam. The LPCA received several questions about what should be done. Residents volunteered on behalf of the Association to seek out advice from the Rideau Valley Conservation Authority, City of Ottawa and Ottawa Carleton Wildlife Centre on whether it was possible to co-exist with this beaver - while maintaining the flow of water and protecting the many trees that line our creek or whether the beaver should be removed. While waiting for a plan or direction, some residents had the dam and then the beaver removed. Unfortunately, this was done without the LPCA's knowledge and so we did not have the opportunity to respond to their concerns directly.

Our waterways and greenspaces are shared and enjoyed by everyone in Leslie Park, and the LPCA's role is to act on behalf of all 800 residents in matters with the City and governing authorities. We are volunteers – we may not have all the answers, but we do try to understand and address everyone's points of view. With future concerns, residents are reminded that they are part of a larger community and that community is served and represented by the LPCA.
